And so, because we find ourselves often scared, tired, and ready to run... because we find ourselves with a death-hold on the rat-race of life... because we need so much to remember Christ's offering for us, we offer ourselves and proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ that we may be for world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood. As Jesus is present at is table, may we set a table for the world, offering moments of solace, peace, grace.
